# MGA SINTOMAS NG KAHIRAPAN

**A**ng trahedyang ika-4 ng Pebrero sa Philippine Sports Arena ay gumanat sa buong Pilipinas pati na sa mga Pilipinoong naminirahan sa ibayong dagat. Pitumpu't apat ang patay at mahigit limang daan ang sugatan nang magkagulo sa pila ng patimpalak ng ABS-CBN na *Wowowee*. Gaya ng dati, panay sisihan ang nangyari. Matukoy man ang may pinakamalaking pananagutan sa incidenteng ito, hindi pa rin maiwasan na maulit itong nuli gaano man ang pag-iingat ng lahat sapagkat ang pangunahing dahilan ng trahedya ay hindi pa rin nalulutas.

Bakit nga ba nangyayari ang mga ganitong incidente? Ano ba ang panghalina ng mga ganitong programa sa masa? Hindi naman tayo nagkakamali kung iiispin natin na lahat ng mga nagsipila sa *Wowowee* ay nangangarap na magkaroon ng magandang buhay. Lahat, kung hindi man malaking porsyento ng mga ito ang nasa ilalim ng *poverty line*. Sa panahong napakabilis ng pagtaas ng presyo ng mga bilihin at pangunahing serbisyo samantalang nananatiling mababa at halos hindi makabuhay ang batayang suweldo, sa panahong mataas ang bilang ng mga walang trabaho, lahat ng pagkakataong magkaroon man lamang ng perang pambili ng mga batayang pangangailangan ay hindi dapat palampasin. Para sa mga naroroon ng araw na iyon, hibhang mapanghalina ang pangako ng programa na *instant* bahay at lupa o pagkakataong makapagtayo ng maliit na negosyo sa halagang mapapanalunan. Kaunting salapi, kaunting suwerte makaahon man lamang sa hirap ng araw-araw na pamumuhay. Tila nawalan na ng pag-asa ang bayan sa kanyang kakayahang mapaunlad ang kanyang buhay sa pamamagitan ng sariling pagsisikap. Tila nawalan na ito ng pagtitiwala sa pamahalaang dapat sana ay tutulong sa pag-angat ng kanyang kabuhayan sa pamamagitan ng mga polisiyang kumakalinga sa kanyang kapakanan.

Walang simplistikong paliwanag ni solusyon sa trahedyang ito sapagkat malalim ang batayang dahilan. Nangangailangan ito ng malalim at tapat na pagsusuri sa bawat isa tungkol sa pananaw natin sa isyu ng *kahirapan* at ang mga ugat na dahilan nito. Ang patuloy na pagdagdag ng mga tao sa mga patimpalak gaya ng *Wowowee*, ang patuloy na pagtaya sa lotto, jai-alai, ending at sweepstakes at ang patuloy na pagbabakasakali sa mga iskemang makapagbibigay sa kanila ng karangyaan sa pinakamabilis na paraan ay ilan lamang sa mga sintomas lamang ng kahirapan. Totoo, nagkulang ang istasyon ng teleserye sa isyu ng kaligtasan ng mga taong naroroon ngunit hindi dapat magtapos ang usaping ito sa isyu ng kaligtasan at kung sino ang mananagot. Hangga't hindi nawawala ang mga batas na gumagarantiya ng kapakanan ng ilan, hangga't hindi nagbabago ang hindi pantay na mga patakaran ng pakikipagkalakalan, hangga't may mga nagsasamantala at may mga nagbubulag-bulagan, hangga't hindi nagbabago ang ating pagtingin sa isyu ng kahirapan, patuloy tayong makakasaksi ng trahedyang *Wowowee*.

The culture of modern people is competition. We want to compete. We love to compete. We get excited when there is competition. We begin by competing in school for grades and awards. And then the competition goes on to oratorical and art contests. Then it goes on to college - for relationships, for career, for politics and for business. Even the present crisis of Iraq and the United States is a product of the culture of competition.

Competition is good but if it is pushed too far, it can make all of us neurotics. We will just trample one another because the goal is to get to the top as soon as we can and as fast as we can.

The culture of the world is competition. But that is **not** the culture of Jesus. The culture of Jesus is called **compassion**.

There was one psychologist who asked, "Is the culture of competition totally opposed to the culture of compassion?" He was saying that if we choose a culture of competition and we can get to the top at the soonest possible time, we could get the most money and the most people to our side.

But as I said, it can burn us out. It can dry us up. It can raise the incidence of suicide. It can raise the incidence of depression. Then we will give more money to psychiatrists for professional fees.

On the other hand, if it is totally and only a culture of compassion, then people will slap one cheek and we will have to offer the other and they will get accustomed to doing that. The culture of compassion is not a culture of passivity. In the end, we will just be black and blue.

Today, my invitation is to ask God to **make us more aggressive for compassion**. Look at those words - **to be more aggressive, to be more convinced towards compassion**. I pray that we will take everything to be more compassionate with one another.

The culture of the Lord and the culture of Christianity is never competition. It is **compassion**. Look at the word **complete** and **compete**. One letter is inserted in the middle and that is L. L is for LOVE. **God came to put love in this world so that we will complete each other and make each other whole**. Jesus came so we could win together because the victory of one need not mean the other's defeat. We can win together if we love together.
