There is an inborn drive in us to want to be distinctive, to be competitive, and to be lavishly admired. Where do we get that? We get that from school. We get that from the culture of professionalism, from going up our career ladders as high and as soon as we can. To be distinctive, to be outstanding, to be multi-awarded, to be recognized, to be lavishly admired have become our aspirations.

The Lord teaches us that while our desire to be admired, be distinctive and outstanding are natural, St. Paul says to us that it does not really matter. He professes that it did not matter if the credit was given to Apollos, to him or any other person. What is important is God is glorified in what we do. In the Gospel, after healing, preaching and in the process of gathering a horde of admirers, Jesus does not entertain the "fans" and instead withdraws to a deserted place, all by Himself, in the presence of God, to pray.

1 Cor. 2:1

If there is a natural drive in us, we might have imbibed it because of professionalism and school competition. We want to be outstanding all the time. The journey, however, of Christianity is not towards distinction. Nor is it towards admiration, popularity nor being outstanding. It is a step-by-step process towards the extinction of our personality so that in the end, it is Christ who takes over us.
